

## Michigan Survey Results

**Q1** Governor Whitmer recently signed several pieces of legislation into law. I am going to list these pieces of legislation and ask if you support or oppose them. Here is the first one: restoring a prevailing wage law requiring contractors hired for state projects to pay union-level wages. Do you support or oppose this?

*Support* ..... 60%  
*Oppose* ..... 29%  
*Not sure* ..... 11%

**Q2** Here's the next one: expanding Michigan's civil rights law to prevent discrimination based on sexual orientation, gender identity, and gender expression. Do you support or oppose this?

*Support* ..... 58%  
*Oppose* ..... 33%

**Q3** Community-based violence intervention programs apply a localized approach to gun violence prevention by providing comprehensive support from trusted community organizations to individuals who are at the greatest risk. Do you support or oppose increased state funding for community-based violence intervention programs?

*Oppose* ..... 25%  
*Not sure* ..... 21%

**Q4** Do you support or oppose allowing victims of gun violence to sue manufacturers, distributors, and dealers with irresponsible, reckless, and negligent sales practices that contribute to gun violence?

**Q5** Currently, someone convicted of a violent misdemeanor in Michigan, such as misdemeanor domestic violence charges like assault, battery, or stalking, is not legally prohibited from purchasing a firearm; this is known as the misdemeanor loophole. Do you support or oppose closing the misdemeanor loophole by lowering the threshold of what crimes can disqualify someone from being able to legally purchase or possess a gun?

**Q6** Do you support or oppose prohibiting firearms at polling locations and absentee voter counting boards?

**Q7** Do you support or oppose prohibiting firearms at the Michigan Capitol for everyone other than law enforcement?

**Q8** President Biden's proposed budget includes a billionaire tax, which would require the wealthiest Americans to pay at least 25% in taxes on all wealth over \$100 million. Do you support or oppose this billionaire tax?

*Support* ..... 59%  
*Oppose* ..... 29%  
*Not sure* ..... 11%

**Q9** Do you believe funding should be increased, cut, or kept the same as it is now for federal programs such as Social Security, Medicare, Medicaid, and food stamps?

*Believe funding should be increased* ..... 59%  
*Believe funding should be cut* ..... 9%  
*Believe it should be kept the same as it is now* ..... 27%  
*Not sure* ..... 5%

**Q10** Under Michigan's current system, wealthy people pay less of their income in taxes than working families. Do you support or oppose balancing Michigan's tax code so high-net-worth individuals pay more in taxes?

*Support* ..... 68%  
*Oppose* ..... 20%  
*Not sure* ..... 12%

**Q11** Currently, some equipment and technology manufacturers restrict competition for repair services by limiting the availability of parts or making the parts difficult to replace, resulting in a monopoly on repair services. Do you support or oppose federal right-to-repair legislation that would ensure farmers can repair agricultural equipment at a reasonable cost and give consumers the possibility of repairing electronics rather than replacing them?

*Support* ..... 81%  
*Oppose* ..... 5%  
*Not sure* ..... 13%

**Q12** Do you support or oppose local governments investing more in community-based services for at-risk youth?

*Support* ..... 69%  
*Oppose* ..... 16%

**Q13** Recently, the Michigan Republican Party Chair Kristina Karamo has drawn criticism for a social media post comparing common sense gun violence prevention measures to the Holocaust. When questioned, Karamo stood behind the statement. Do these comments make you more or less likely to support a Republican candidate for public office, or do they not make a difference?

*More likely* ..... 14%  
*Less likely* ..... 42%  
*It doesn't make a difference* ..... 37%  
*Not sure* ..... 7%

**Q14** In the 2020 election for President, did you vote for Republican Donald Trump, Democrat Joe Biden, someone else, or did you not vote in the election?

*Donald Trump* ..... 46%  
*Joe Biden* ..... 49%  
*Someone else / Did not vote* ..... 5%

**Q15** If you are a woman, press 1. If a man, press 2. If you are gender non-binary, press 3.

*Woman* ..... 52%  
*Man* ..... 46%  
*Gender non-binary* ..... 3%

**Q16** If you are a Democrat, press 1. If a Republican, press 2. If an independent, press 3.

*Democrat* ..... 35%  
*Republican* ..... 33%  
*Independent* ..... 32%

**Q17** If you are white, press 1. If African-American, press 2. If other, press 3.

*White* ..... 80%  
*African-American* ..... 13%  
*Other* ..... 6%

**Q18** If you are 18-45 years old, press 1. If 46-65, press 2. If older than 65, press 3.

18 to 45..... 34%  
46 to 65..... 37%  
Older than 65..... 29%

**Q19** What is the highest level of education you have received: high school graduate or less, some college but did not finish, 2-year college degree, 4-year college degree, or post-graduate degree?

High school graduate or less ..... 28%  
Some college but did not finish..... 26%  
2-year college degree ..... 14%  
4-year college degree ..... 18%  
Post-graduate degree ..... 14%

**Q20** Are you or is anyone in your household a current or former member of a labor union?

Yes..... 49%  
No ..... 51%

**Q21** Do you personally own or live with someone who owns a firearm?

Yes..... 49%
